Recognizing the Resurrected Jesus

The story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus is one of my favorites. Usually it is not too hard to see Christ in those we like and who attract us. We can easily recognize Him in those kind, compassionate, likable people who touch our lives. It is more difficult to see the Lord in the less attractive or unpleasant people we meet. Many times we consciously or unconsciously ignore Christ's presence

in the street people, in the addicted and those who don't live up to how we think a "good" person should act. This is the experience of someone who failed to recognize Jesus :

" A still vivid example in my life happened recently. I was with a group of very good, wonderful Catholics and a poor person who had one too many drinks wandered into the room where we were meeting. It was a cold, bitter night and he was obviously walking. He asked for some directions to where he could get a newspaper to check out the job openings. After we sent him back in the cold, several people made jokes and other not so kind remarks about him. I still feel bad that I did not do something concrete for him. Ironically, the talk that night was about Jesus' unconditional love for each person. Somehow we seemed to forget that his love included that man as well". In the Gospel of Matthew Jesus preaches about the last judgment when He tells us that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters we do for Him. And it works the other way too. When we ignore any of our brothers and sisters, we also ignore Him. When I drive around the city and see people with signs that read, "Will work for food," I feel very guilty when I don't stop or try to help them. It is so easy to be swayed by those who say things like, "There are a lot of con artists out there," or "It is too dangerous, you may get robbed or hurt." I can rationalize, but down deep it causes a dilemma for me and I can just hear the words of the Lord saying, "I was hungry and you did not feed Me." Recognizing Jesus in the poor and needy is crucial, but we are also challenged to see Him in the people in our everyday lives; in the fellow student it seems nobody likes; in the coworker who never stops complaining; or in the neighbor who keeps loud music on late into the night.

It seems to me that a good practice during this Easter season is to try to really see Jesus in those we encounter and to treat everyone with the same respect we would give Jesus if we saw Him in person and remind ourselves that Christ loves them just as much as He loves us. Imagine what the world would be like if each one of us would really do this?

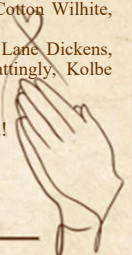

St. Joseph the Worker Novena

Join our parish in the St. Joseph Novena beginning April 23 ending on the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1. Join us for daily Mass on May 1st at 5:30pm



The Feast of St. Joseph the Worker is May 1. A relatively new feast in the liturgical calendar, it was introduced in 1955 by Pope Pius XII. This special day and novena commemorate St. Joseph as someone who most gracefully integrated spiritual life with his daily, laborious life as a father, husband, and worker.

The patron saint of the Church and guardian of the Holy Family, Joseph is a beautiful example for us to follow God's purpose despite what the world might say or what little recognition we might get for doing so.

Pray this novena to St. Joseph the Worker for nine days, culminating on May 1 (Feast of St. Joseph the Worker). We can pray this novena to ask for Joseph's special care over a particular intention such as help in an area of our lives needing discernment.

Make the Sign of the Cross Recite the novena:

Joseph, by the work of your hands and the sweat of your brow, you supported Jesus and Mary, and had the Son of God as your fellow worker. Teach me to work as you did, with patience and perseverance, for God and for those whom God has given me to support. Teach me to see in my fellow workers the Christ who desires to be in them, that I may always be charitable and forbearing towards all. Grant me to look upon work with the eyes of faith, so that I shall recognize in it my share in God's own creative activity and in Christ's work of our redemption, and so take pride in it. When it is pleasant and productive, remind me to give thanks to God for it. And when it is burdensome, teach me to offer it to God, in reparation for my sins and the sins of the world. O good father Joseph! I beg you, by all your sufferings, sorrows and joys, to obtain for me what I now ask. Obtain for all those who have asked my prayers, everything that is useful to them in the plan of God. Be near to me in my last moments that I may eternally sing the praises of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Amen.

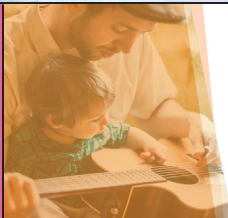

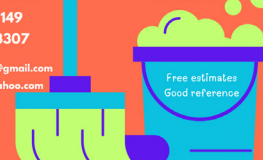

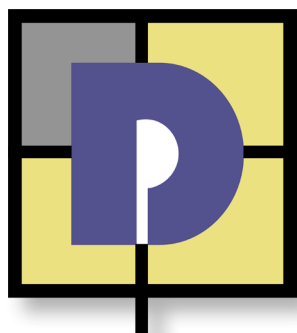
