On the Fourth Sunday of Easter, called Good Shepherd Sunday, we continue to reflect about the meaning of the Resurrection. This is also the World Day of Prayer for vocations. Today we celebrate the risen Lord as Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. As a good Shepherd, Jesus knows his sheep and his sheep hear his voice: Jesus knows each one of us, our needs, our merits and our faults. He

loves us as we are and calls each of us by name. He goes in search of his stray lambs and heals his sick ones. Jesus heals the wounds of our souls by the Sacrament of Reconciliation and strengthens us in illness and old age by the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

The Gospel text offers us both comfort and challenge. The comforting good news is that Jesus the Good Shepherd knows us, provides for us and loves us. The challenge is that we should be good shepherds to those entrusted to our care. Parents are called to be good shepherd: that means they have to be attentive to what their kids are watching on TV or on the computer. They are called to attentive to what their kids are doing. On top of this, they are to have patience, patience and patience with their kids. Let us become good shepherds: Everyone who is entrusted with the care of others is a shepherd. Hence pastors, parents, teachers, doctors, nurses, government officials and politicians are all shepherds. On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations we are asked to encourage and pray for our young men to respond to God's call to serve His Church in the ministerial priesthood. Nevertheless, each one of us should be asking ourselves today:

Is what I am spending my energies on every day my real vocation? Is this what God wants me to be doing with my life? How is what I am doing giving witness to my Christian faith? So today we ask for the grace to make Jesus, the Good Shepherd, the model for our lives. And also, we should ask for the grace to try to be good shepherds for other people, beginning with those who are closest to us, in our homes and in our families.

I will be leaving for vacations to Congo on May 7th and will be back on Jun 10th. I will continue praying for everyone and ask you to pray for me. ~ Fr Kalombo

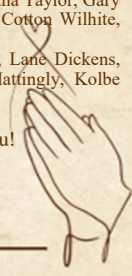

**St. Joseph the Worker Novena**  
Join our parish in the St. Joseph Novena beginning April 23 ending on the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1. **Join us for daily Mass on May 1st at 5:30pm**

The Feast of St. Joseph the Worker is May 1. A relatively new feast in the liturgical calendar, it was introduced in 1955 by Pope Pius XII. This special day and novena commemorate St. Joseph as someone who most gracefully integrated spiritual life with his daily, laborious life as a father, husband, and worker.

The patron saint of the Church and guardian of the Holy Family, Joseph is a beautiful example for us to follow God's purpose despite what the world might say or what little recognition we might get for doing so.

Pray this novena to St. Joseph the Worker for nine days, culminating on May 1 (Feast of St. Joseph the Worker). We can pray this novena to ask for Joseph's special care over a particular intention such as help in an area of our lives needing discernment.

**Make the Sign of the Cross**  
**Recite the novena:**

*Joseph, by the work of your hands and the sweat of your brow, you supported Jesus and Mary, and had the Son of God as your fellow worker. Teach me to work as you did, with patience and perseverance, for God and for those whom God has given me to support. Teach me to see in my fellow workers the Christ who desires to be in them, that I may always be charitable and forbearing towards all. Grant me to look upon work with the eyes of faith, so that I shall recognize in it my share in God's own creative activity and in Christ's work of our redemption, and so take pride in it. When it is pleasant and productive, remind me to give thanks to God for it. And when it is burdensome, teach me to offer it to God, in reparation for my sins and the sins of the world. O good father Joseph! I beg you, by all your sufferings, sorrows and joys, to obtain for me what I now ask. Obtain for all those who have asked my prayers, everything that is useful to them in the plan of God. Be near to me in my last moments that I may eternally sing the praises of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Amen.*

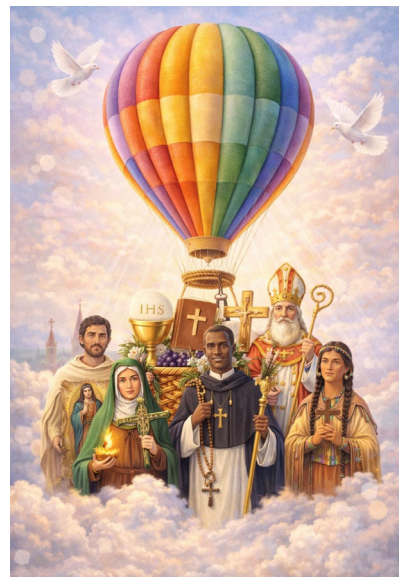
