I want to see again: I want to see again, says the blind man to Jesus. It is beautiful story . It is about the healing of blind man. The first time I read the story about this story, I said to myself, this is not for us because we are not blind people. Nobody in the community is blind. But when I read it careful and look at around me, I realized that physically we are not blind. But spiritually we are. We are blind because we don't see the hands of God in our lives. There are so many good things God is doing in our community. How God bless us every day with life, children, new people , and job. We are blind because we don't see the treasure we have, the Eucharist we celebrate

Wednesday and Friday with very few people. We are blind because we don't see people like God sees them. We judge people for how they look, how they work and what they have. We don't see what they are. We don't see the image of God in each person. All of this leads me to ask myself : Do we see all the people we meet as Jesus sees them or we ignore some ? Who is blind ? Or who really see ?

In today's gospel, we are told the story about the blind man Bartimeus. Sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth passing by, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." When Jesus saw him, He stopped everything to pay personal attention to him. That's how important he to Jesus. I have no doubt that every human being matters for Jesus. Then Jesus asked him : "What do you want me to do for you?". I want to see , says the blind man. And Jesus cured him. And after being healed, he followed Jesus. We can learn a lot from today's gospel . In one side , we have to recognize and accept that we are blind. Our world is blind. Like Bartimeus, we have to beg Jesus to open our eyes so that we can see all the people we meet as Jesus sees them. In other side , today's gospel challenges us to pay more attention to the forgotten, hungry, those who cry for justice, tragedy, to those the world holds in little regard and to those the world condemns , to the refugees, broken families, those hit by tragedy that never interest television. Because the media the media blinds us. It presents us superstars in sports, in music, beautiful people, big companies,... nice movies, nice cartoon, what people like to see but it does present us the other side of the reality. So, blindness needs to be cured. We want to see, Lord.we want to see your face through each person we meet. This is the message for today. Let us ask God to open our eyes so that we can see people like He sees them. This should be our prayer for this week.

What is Stewardship?

Stewardship is about thanking God for all the gifts He gives us. It is a prayerful, planned, and proportionate giving of our time, talent, and treasure. We recognize that all we have ultimately comes from God, and we thank the Lord by returning to God some of what we have received.

The Three Aspects of Stewardship: Time, Talent, Treasure

TIME: Stewardship begins with taking care of and sharing the gift of time. Plan a careful schedule to include time for prayer and the sacraments. This is vital in the stewardship of our physical, emotional, spiritual, and intellectual lives.

TALENT: Our talents are special blessings from God. When we volunteer to help others by sharing our talents, we give something more precious than our time or our money.

TREASURE: Our treasures, both money and possessions, are gifts from God that we are asked to care for and generously share for our own benefit and for the benefit of others.

A Stewardship Way of Life Leads to Discipleship

The US Bishop's Pastoral Letter of Stewardship invites all Catholics to invest themselves—time, talent, and treasure- in the mission and ministries of the Church. This invitation is a challenge for each of us to live a life of gratitude, accountability, and generosity. A stewardship way of life is a way that truly seeks to live as a disciple of Jesus.

Stewardship is based on a biblical view of God as Creator and ourselves as servants. From this perspective, we are encouraged to develop or renew the practice of regularly reflecting on God's love for us and the goodness of our lives. With a sure sense of our blessings in mind, we are encouraged to make GRATITUDE the fundamental motive for our giving. The Bible also reminds us that as servants we are accountable to God for the use of our gifts of time, talent, and treasure—this is STEWARDSHIP.

As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace.

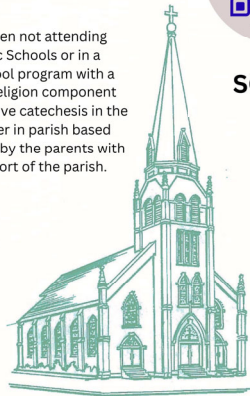

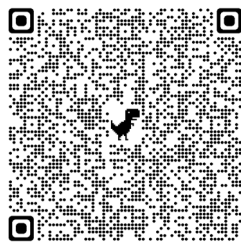
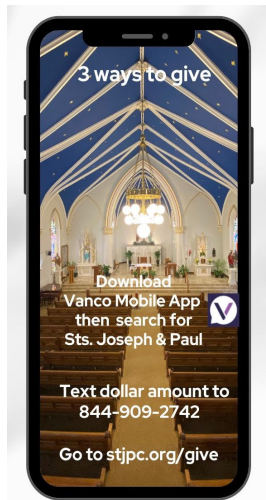

Give this country a renewal of devotion to you, to your law and to your commandments, Lord.

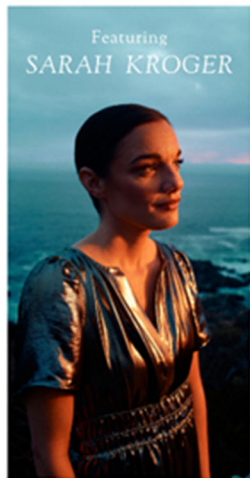
